It is harrowing even to imagine what is happening in Israel-Palestine, and let me not forget Ukraine, Manipur in India, Myanmar, Nicaragua and many other countries across the world. Violence, killings everywhere and worse still, the words of vengeance from the leaders. I am unable to share with as much joy as ever the various social and ecological actions around the world in this HL. You can understand why. Our world still faces challenges to build peace, reconciliation and prosperity for all. War and violence seem to blur our vision to see each other as human beings. Yet, as we approach COP28, we cannot forget that the climate crisis has received an inadequate response from states, as the Holy Father acknowledged in his recent apostolic exhortation, *Laudate Deum*. Fr Arturo Sosa, in *De Statu* (p24), also said how in our present world, 'human relations are increasingly affected by violence with many faces'. As the Pope urged, let us consciously take only one side, that is PEACE.

In this context, it is worth reexamining our commitment to social justice and discerning what more we can do to build a better and sustainable future. Examining witnesses is a good way of achieving the latter goal. The life of **Father Michael Campbell-Johnston**, for example, my predecessor between 1975 and 1985, who returned to the father on 12 October at the age of 92. He devoted his life entirely to promoting justice and walking with the excluded. The same goes for the 25 stories we have published in our new book "Cannonball Moments: Testimonies of Conversion". Reading them can help us reexamine our lives and inspire us to make this personal commitment. We'll be launching it on 10 November.






Why I Got Involved in the Movement that Cares for Victims of Human Trafficking






