Warm greetings from Rome!

A couple of days ago, COP28 concluded. We went to Dubai, UAE, with a relatively clear idea of our expectations for this important gathering on climate change, thanks to the declaration we prepared as an Ignatian family. We felt strengthened by the strong call of Pope Francis expressed in *Laudate Deum* and his intention to take an active part in this gathering. I want to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to all the members of our apostolic body who accompanied this event, either remotely or by their presence alongside the delegations or by their efforts to report the event to anyone who wished to follow through the communication from Ecojesuit team.

Even if our expectations were not completely fulfilled, we accept the outcome, not grudgingly but with gratitude and a sincere desire to work harder and to advocate for and with the people in the coming years. One of the positive things that happened was the recognition of the faith groups' role in leading the change that the world needs today. It encourages our ecological advocacy network to press ahead to catalyse the action required for a sustainable world. As Pope Francis said, to imagine that "there is nothing to hope for would be suicidal" (LD #53). Let us continue to advocate for changes from the political leaders. But let us not forget that "there are no lasting changes without cultural changes, without a maturing lifestyles... and personal changes" (LD #70). Let us continue our actions and reflections with a firm HOPE.

The limited action taken by the Conference of Parties to achieve the objectives shows the extent to which other related parameters must also be considered to facilitate movement. These include the search for peace and, above all, the proper use of human discoveries. This is why the Holy Father based his message for the 2024 World Day of Peace on "Artificial Intelligence and Peace". He prayed "that the rapid development of forms of artificial intelligence will not increase cases of inequality and injustice all too present in today's world, but will help put an end to wars and conflicts, and alleviate many forms of

suffering that afflict our human family". Only in this way can the world resolutely tackle the challenges of caring for our common home.

May Jesus be born in our minds and hearts to be, live, and love like him!




